Purpose

The purpose of the Northern Colorado Artist Community is to enhance lives in the Northern Colorado community through all forms of art.

Mission Statement

NOCOAC shall enhance lives through all forms and dissemination of art; encouraging and supporting individual expression, providing public presentations, involving and expanding community programs at all levels and promoting art appreciation.

Strategies to Accomplish the NOCOAC Mission

The primary purpose of this nonprofit public benefit corporation is to enhance lives through all forms of art. This will be accomplished by:

1. Provide instruction to our members and the community in as many forms of art as possible. Including art for display inside as well as outside
2. Provide as many arts educational activities as possible for all ages of people and provide space for them to display their art
3. Promote public art exhibits
4. Arrange for artists to display their art in other venues for the appreciation of the community
5. Provide space for the community or artists to meet and exchange ideas.
6. Encourage the exchange of art with other communities for the advancement of art and culture in the local community
7. Solicit artists to go into the public schools and provide instruction in all forms of art for the education and benefit of the children of the community. In partnership with the school administration and teachers

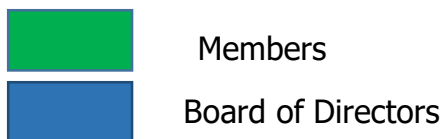
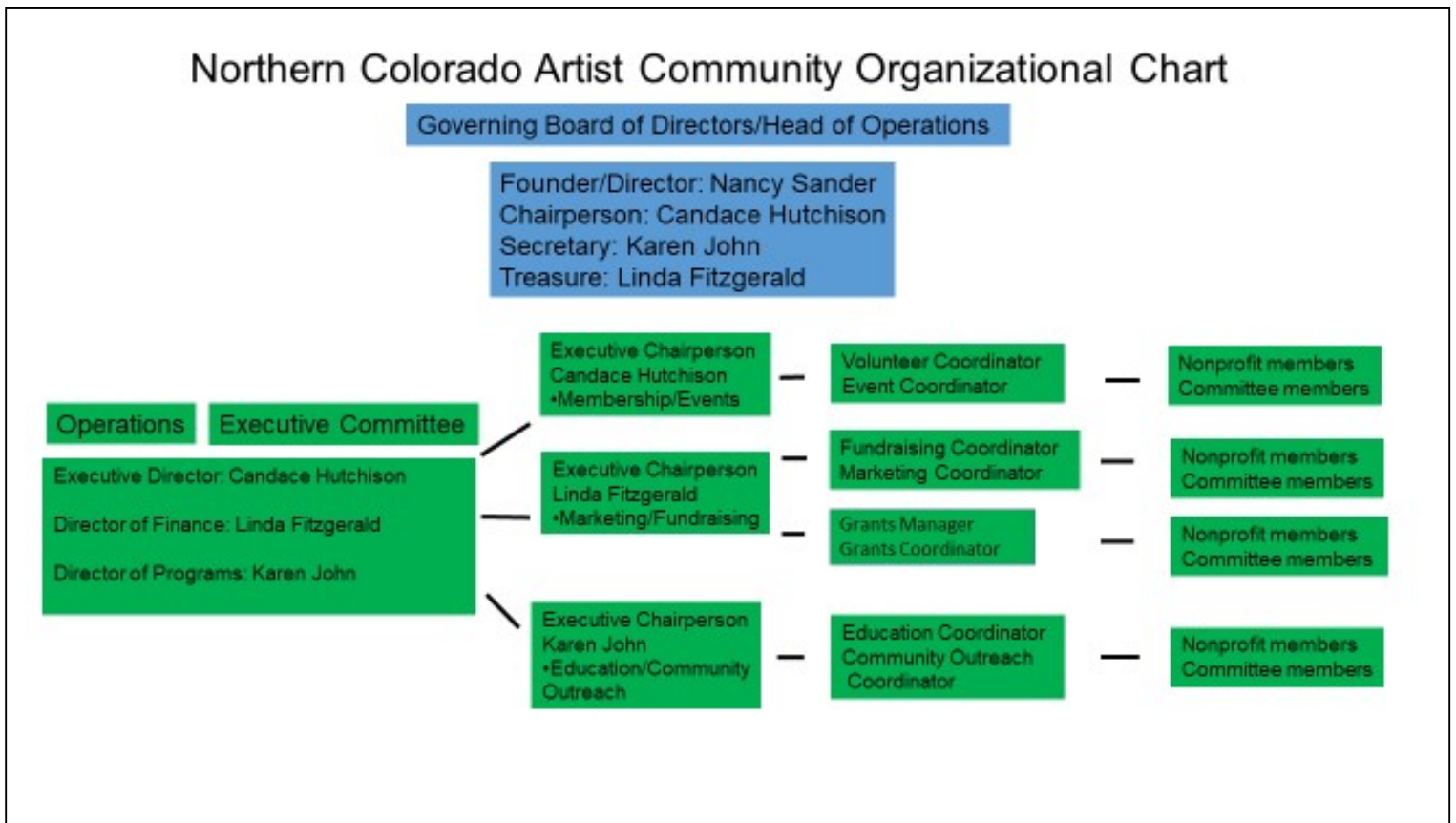

Organizational Structure



Board of Directors

- A Director on the board may serve a term limited to 3 years and may be reelected by the Board of Directors for a second term of 3 years

- Officers on the Board of Directors may serve a term of 2 years and may be reelected by the Board of Directors for a second term of 2 years
- An Officer or Director can resign at any time
- Board of Directors can vote additional Directors and Officers on the board from the membership as needed
- The Board of Directors may appoint or hire Executive Committee Chairpersons and grant the committee powers
- The Directors on the Board will have sole voting power

Board of Directors Code of Conduct

In addition to adhering to the general membership code of conduct listed on page the Board of Directors will also follow these guidelines for conduct:

- The Board of Directors will respectfully consider all ideas from the membership in all areas concerning the nonprofit, including but not limited to: membership, events, marketing, fundraising, education and community outreach
- Members will discuss ideas pertaining to the committee on which they serve, during committee meetings
- The Coordinator or Executive Chair of each committee will present these ideas to the Executive Committee and The Executive Committee Chairs will present to the Board of Directors
- The Board of Directors will vote on the ideas while considering potential concerns, such as: conflicting dates, budget, liability, etc...and communicate their decisions in a timely manner to the members of the committees

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEES

All committee members must be a member of NOCOAC.

Membership Committee Chairperson: Candace Hutchison

Purpose

To find, engage and retain members of the public in order to provide financial and committee support to the organization, (NOCOAC)

Goals and Expectations

- The Membership Committee will provide written reports to the Executive Director about its meetings, attendance, recommendations and actions taken

- Committee will meet on an “as-needed” basis or at the request of any members of the committee. Meetings may be held in person or via zoom
- Develop and implement membership recruitment ideas and promotions
- Develop innovative projects to enhance membership retention
- Provide written request for promotional monies for Board approval
- Email official welcome greeting to new members, both basic and business levels
- Have a greeter at membership receptions to welcome members
- Update and maintain membership web page
- Create and email “Friends of NOCOAC” newsletter

Marketing/Fundraising Committee Chairperson: Linda Fitzgerald

Marketing Committee Purpose

To develop and execute ideas to get maximum exposure to Colorado communities of the existence and purpose of NOCOAC

Goals and Expectations

- Promoting NOCOAC on Social Media sites
- Press releases in Colorado newspapers
- Public Service announcements on Colorado Radio Stations

Fundraising Committee Purpose

To develop and expedite ideas for financial support for NOCOAC through membership and non-membership fees and/or donations and events

Events such as Ice Cream Social, Fine Art Auction, “Other” item auctions

Grant Writing Committee

Purpose

To secure grants monies for NOCOAC programs to benefit the community

Goals and Expectations

- Work with a grant writing professional or company to find and apply for grants
- Develop data driven activities to enhance grant applications
- Follow up collecting data after activities

Education/Community Outreach Committee Chairperson: Karen John

Education Committee Purpose

To provide education in all art forms to all ages to enhance the Northern Colorado Community

Goals and Expectations

- Create no pressure spaces for beginners, intermediate and advanced students to learn about art
- Provide programs in visual arts, folk/craft arts, music, theater arts, literary arts, sewing, landscaping, etc....
 - To introduce basic art concepts
- Provide opportunity for youth and adults to display their art
- Provide opportunity for youth and adults to participate in public art
- Serve the community by sending art facilitators to facilitate programs in the public schools, homeless shelters, nursing homes, special needs classes, etc...
- Provide tours of the Sanderosa Gallery (and other galleries) with a volunteer artist guide to discuss works in the gallery pointing out the artists' use of shape, color, etc...
- Make people aware of other galleries and studios that are providing art programs that may not be offered at the Sanderosa

Community Outreach Committee

Community Outreach Purpose

To serve the Northern Colorado Community by participating in community activities designed to enhance the community

Goals and Expectations

- Public space beautification (sculpture, mural, trash clean up, community gardens)
- Supporting outside community fundraising events
- Provide opportunity for youth and adults to display their art
- Provide opportunity for youth and adults to participate in public art
- Serve the community by sending artists to facilitate programs in the public schools, homeless shelters, nursing homes, special needs classes, etc...
- Provide tours of the Sanderosa Gallery (and other galleries) with a volunteer artist guide to discuss works in the gallery pointing out the artists' use of shape, color, etc...

MEMBERSHIP

Nondiscrimination Statement

The Northern Colorado Artist Community does not discriminate against individuals or groups based on age, political affiliation, race, national origin, gender, class, disability, sexual orientation, gender expression or religious beliefs.

Membership Guidelines

1. Membership is open during anytime of the year
 - a. **Fees will not be prorated**
 - b. Membership renewal due by January 15 or membership will be discontinued
2. Members will fill out membership application and return to NOCOAC
 - a. Members or Sponsors will receive Organization Donation Receipt
3. Must be a member to organize and carry out a function through NOCOAC such as facilitating events or volunteering
4. Members of NOCOAC do not have to be artists or have art in Sanderosa Gallery
5. Artists displaying art in the gallery do not have to be members of NOCOAC

Basic Membership \$45/year

- Annual Show for Artists in the gallery and members
- Yearly meeting with the Board of Directors
- Free reception for designated events
- Membership mention on web page
- Members **are not required** to volunteer
- Opportunity to use the gallery to facilitate programs independent of nonprofit programs
 - 1 program per year \$10
 - 3 programs per year \$25
 - 7 programs per year \$60
 - 12 programs per year \$100

Business Membership \$100/year

- All of the basic membership benefits
- Logo and one sentence promotion in the newsletter once a year
- Framed certificate of membership to display
- Opportunity to sponsor an event for **\$50 more per event**
 - Artist designed poster with business logo at the bottom will be displayed at the gallery prior to the event
 - Receive an 8" X 10" of artist designed poster via email for own personal advertising
 - Poster will be promoted on Gallery's Facebook/Instagram pages

Student Membership \$10/year

- Student membership is \$10 per year with a valid ID or letter from the school. They will be entitled to all the benefits of the basic membership

Family Membership \$85/year

- Up to 5 people in the membership
 - List names on the membership application
- All must be living at the same address
- Will receive all the same benefits as the basic membership

PROGRAMS

Programs include events, classes, demonstrations, shows, festivals, etc...

Program facilitators

Two types of program facilitators

1 Facilitators independent from nonprofit developed programs

- Will be subject to the price tiers for use of the gallery space listed above and repeated here.
 - 1 program per year \$10
 - 3 programs per year \$25
 - 7 programs per year \$60
 - 12 programs per year \$100
- Will fill out an application describing their program for approval by the board
- Will set their own prices to include supplies and their instruction time
- Will collect their own money for the program
- Will participate actively in their own promotion
- Will be promoted by NOCOAC and/or Sanderosa Gallery

2 Facilitators invited by nonprofit developed programs

- Volunteers asked to participate in nonprofit programs as a facilitator will not be asked to pay for use of the gallery
- Will have access to use of the supply closet donations

- Will have an opportunity to request additional funds from the board for extra supplies
- The program will be promoted by the NOCOAC and/or Sanderosa Gallery

Programs offered after the gallery has closed, for the day, will require a member of the nonprofit to remain at the Gallery until the after-hours program is finished and will close up the Gallery.

Volunteers

- Must be a member of NOCOAC
- Must receive basic volunteer training
 - Dates and times to be determined
- Will keep track of hours in a volunteer logbook kept at the Sanderosa Gallery

MEMBERS CODE OF CONDUCT

- Members will maintain an attitude of kindness, inclusion and encouragement toward all other members, prospective members, gallery visitors, event collaborators, other artists in the community at large and general public when representing the gallery
- Members will refrain from intoxication or being under the influence of any other recreational drug legal or illegal while at the gallery, attending an event that includes the gallery and or representing the gallery in any other way
- Members will refrain from any other type of illegal unethical activity when representing the gallery
- When volunteering in the gallery members will refrain from negatively critiquing artists' artwork to prospective buyers, or any other person in the gallery
- Solicited critiques will be kind and honest and stem from a genuine intent to help the artist succeed. Said critiques will occur in a manner that will not lead to embarrassment for the artist seeking advice
