PURPOSE of the Northern Colorado Artist Community (NOCOAC) is to enrich lives in the Northern Colorado community through all forms of art.

MISSION is to enhance lives through all forms and dissemination of art; encouraging and supporting individual expression, providing public presentations, involving and expanding community programs at all levels and promoting art appreciation.

Our community investment and involvement:

- Broaden the concept of art.
- Discover and support the "artist" within.
- Provide diversified arts instruction to our members and the community, in-house and at public locations.
- In partnership with schools and outreach programs, provide a variety of art instruction.
- Encourage the exchange of art with other communities for the advancement of expression, aesthetics, social awareness and integration.
- Promote and provide public art and artists' exhibits in various locals.
- Provide space for the community and artists to share works, ideas and studio space.
- Collaborate with other art-centric organizations.

NOTE from EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

Established two and a half years ago, NOCO Artist Community was formed because it afforded us certain privileges which in turn provided a platform to offer a variety of art-focused ventures that a for-profit art gallery could not.

Running a nonprofit was a new animal for us, with only three volunteer board members and Nancy, the founder. The first year, at times, we splashed wildly in the deep end while this naivety was a welcomed asset. We were wide open to experimentation and possibilities, without being stunted by corporate conventionalities. We felt privileged taking on this challenging endeavor of keeping art vital.

The next year, 2024, we felt more comfortable, seeing our ideas play out. Of course, there were a few that didn't and others that needed tweaking but for the most part we found our groove. We were able to ask two more to join the board which has proven invaluable and helped enhance our efforts.

We applied for BBB accreditation. Passing 20 standards, we were awarded BBB Charities Accountability and Accreditation.

We continue to provide a diverse array of free monthly programs to spark wonder and community. We were given a grant from Fort Collins Rotary Club for a STEAM related kids' week long camp. From destruction to beauty, *Ink on the Wild Side* created ink and art from Rist Canyon wildfire wood. The kids explored wildfire causes, positives and negatives of wildfire and prevention of wildfire. We were also awarded a grant from Dwain Horn Memorial Fund to be used in 2025 for Tuesday Talks.

Looking into our crystal ball, we see continual expansion. We are always on the hunt for grants and donations to fuel our vision ... a place where expression is encouraged, culture is praised, and diversity is embraced.



NOCOAC CORE PROGRAMS

Tuesday Talks: is a free monthly community program about sparking wonder and connecting people to the world beyond themselves through the art of story telling.

First Friday Art Walk: is a free monthly community program providing varied artistic activities (like music, art, literature, dance) and displays to increase the community's awareness of local aptitude and talents.

Educational Art classes on and off site—school and Loveland Public Library: are to stimulate imaginations, foster problem solving and observational skills, nurture and engage the senses and build gross and fine motor skills. This contributes to the child's self-esteem and socialization.

Story Time: is a free monthly community program for pre-Kindergarten children. Read aloud stories help children develop pre reading skills such as: story elements, book language, print directionality and comprehension. A craft related to the story follows to support reading comprehension and gross and fine motor skills.

Blast and Scrap (nonprofit): supports young and emerging musicians and artists by providing performance and workshop space that advances social inclusion and environmental sustainability in the arts.

Hats for Those in Need: free community all day fall program to knit or crochet a hat for the unhoused in the Fort Collins area. A two hour crochet class is offered for beginners to encourage new crafters in the needle arts.

Kids Camp (12-14years): week long summer program

- 2024 program: Ink on the Wild Side has been made possible by a Rotary Club Grant (STEM Grant)
 - Make ink out of burnt wood from local burn scared areas
 - Explore chemistry behind creating ink from charcoal and the ecology of wildfire
 - Create art with their ink

Artist Group: monthly meetings to build an artist collective to share knowledge, provide support and mentorship.

Annual Art Shows: month long show displaying 2D and 3D art. A Community Reception opens each show. The art is for sale without commission.

Community Art Installation: providing art to local organizations.

- Offers artists an opportunity to show their works in different locals.
- Offers organizations an opportunity to enhance their image and stimulate the work environment. Art in the work place is a social connector and fosters a sense of pride through supporting local artists.

NOCOAC SUPPORTERS

2025 PLANS:

- Develop relationships with several local Senior Living facilities
 - To offer gallery tours, keep them informed about our monthly programs and provide art classes at their location for residents.
- Expand Tuesday Talks from 10-12 presentations
- Add 2 additional free monthly programs
 - In Pursuit Wednesday: 2 part series—discussion/lecture on a range of riveting topics followed by a hands-on workshop the next week.
 - Tasty Thursday: a culinary adventure of smorgasbord of demos, chit-chats, instructive lectures and food sampling
- Reference library: a small public reference library for both adults and children
- Hire a marketing firm to increase our social media presence, grow our newsletter audience and develop our brand
